- c) <u>Comm. Dev. Agency/Tran. Div. Dep. Director</u> Don Spear gave a briefing on his agency. He will submit Logan's Grade realignment for a grant which is competitive so there is no guarantee.

- e) <u>U.S. Forest Service</u> Mark Johnson helped with yesterday's fire using the El Dorado Hotshots. June 9-10th they will be burning on Baltic Ridge for skill preparations. Starting June 12th all the firefighting staff and equipment will be in position ready to fight fires.

- g) <u>El Dorado County Sheriff</u> Todd Crawford briefed on Sheriff's Department. CERT & SAR may be asked to help with Tree Mortality issues. June 17th will be a tree mortality workshop.
- h) <u>El Dorado County Fire Safe Council</u> Ernie Lory briefed on May's meeting. <u>Awildfiresnearme.com</u> is a new website to see fires that are near. <u>Yubanet.com</u> is a state site showing fire activity.
- i) Neighboring Fire Safe Councils Dave Pratt briefed on activity of Pleasant Valley Grange FSC. He noted using texting is valuable when a full cell signal is not available. Having a photo with your pet will aid in identifying your animals in a disaster. Have a "go bag" and plan based on different time frames of time available to vacate during a disaster. Ernie Lory added that El Dorado County FSC is working on public awareness on "go bags".
